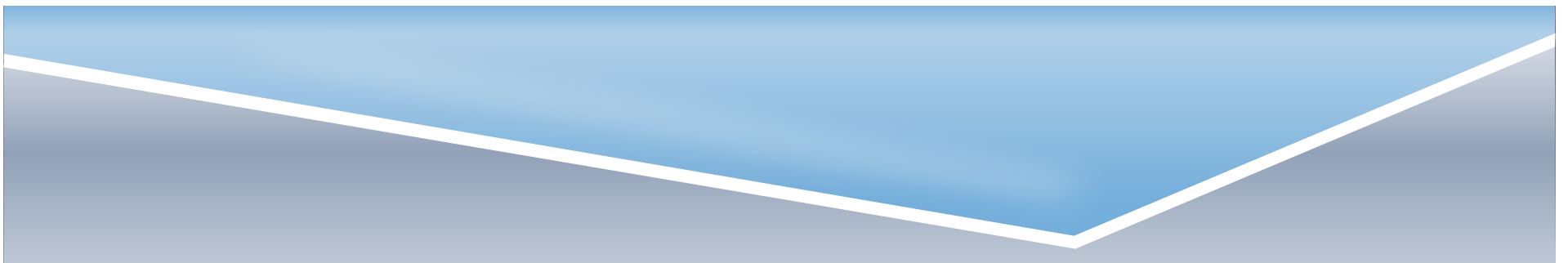


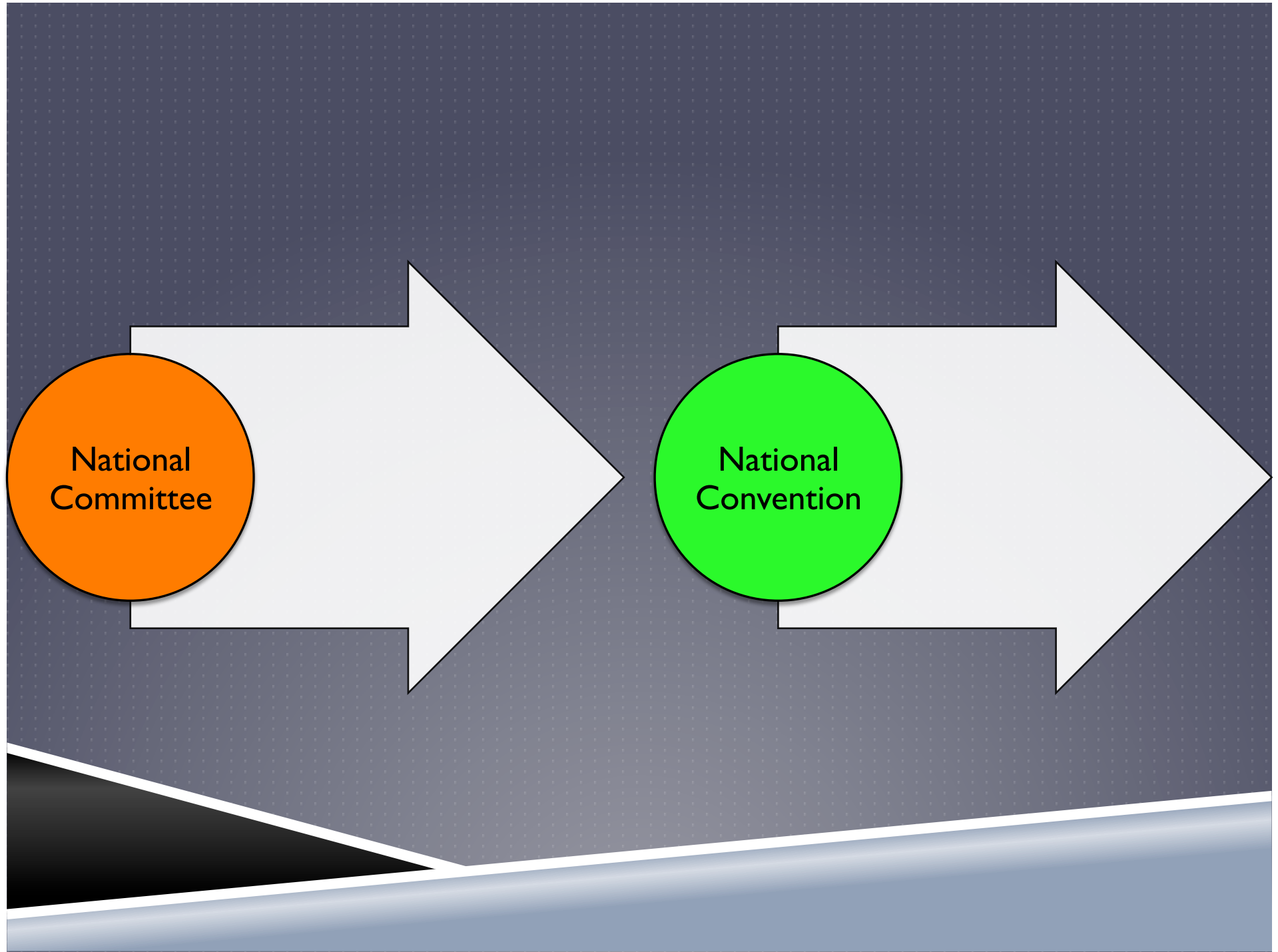

Voters do not need to declare their party preference in order to vote for the party's nominees
